## Survey Design

- **Focusing on four primary groups of recreational anglers:**
  - Commercial passenger fishing vessels
  - Private boat recreational anglers
  - Kayak-based anglers
  - Pier and shore anglers
- **Stratified study area into 3 geographic regions**
  - Ocean Beach in San Francisco County and south to include the main port at Pillar Point,
  - San Francisco Bay access points to Point Reyes, and
  - Point Reyes north to Alder Creek to include the main harbor at Bodega Bay.

## Data Collection

- **Same as commercial fisheries data collection**
  - Open OceanMap
- **Shared protocol: Identify all fishing areas/locations that are of value over their cumulative fishing experience, and to rank these using a weighted percentage (i.e. an imaginary “bag of 100 pennies” that they distribute over the fishing grounds)**

## Data Collection - Values

- **Values are expressed and ranked by fishermen as well. This is to help explain why recreational fishermen value particular areas (see draft document):**
  - Absence of commercial fishing presence
  - Absence of other fishermen (i.e. seclusion)
  - Availability of high numbers of fish
  - Availability of large fish
  - Boat size/type
  - Communication with/suggestions of other fishermen
  - Price of fuel
  - Proximity to harbor facility/access point
  - Travel time to the location
  - Weather

## Data Collection – Completed Interviews

- **Total Completed – 101**
  - Commercial passenger fishing vessels – 20
  - Private boat recreational anglers – 49
  - Kayak-based anglers – 13
  - Pier and shore anglers - 19

## Analyzing the Fishing Grounds

- **Same method of analysis as developed in central coast process – creating a weighted surface that represents the stated importance of different areas for each fishery**
- **Unlike the commercial fishing grounds, no weighting occurs**
  - Strictly based on stated importance

- Draft maps have been reviewed and verified by a select number of fishermen so that they are now available in DRAFT form in order to make them available to the RSG at this meeting
